Nuns On The Bus: Stopping In Fayetteville.

This is the fourth "Nuns on the Bus" tour which began Sept. 10 in St. Louis and will make two stops in Arkansas.

On Sunday, Sept 13, the tour will stop for a town hall meeting at 1:00 pm at St. Paul's Episcopal Church. Later that same day, they will go to Little Rock.

The Vatican implemented a six year long investigation of the group starting The Nuns On The Bus campaign. Church officials said that members of the group, the Leadership Conference of Women Religious (LCWR), had challenged church teaching on homosexuality and the male-only priesthood, and promoted "radical feminist themes incompatible with the Catholic faith." Obama Care was another ingredient in the disagreement stew, pitching the sisters who were for it, against the Vatican who was against it, as the coverage included insurance coverage for contraception. The LCWR represents 80% of all Catholic nuns in the US, whose founding principle was opposition to proposed legislative cutbacks to social welfare programs for children and families.

The Vatican's crackdown triggered protests in support of the group and the sisters mobilized grassroots support through the successful Nuns on a Bus campaign, a symbol of their unwillingness to back down. They organized the tours in an attempt to refocus the church as a champion of war, poverty, and racism, instead of the current focus, which centered around traditional marriage and abortion.

The nun's unique combination of enthusiasm and spiritual sass appears to have paid off. The new pope, Pope Francis, has expressed a desire to have a more merciful approach to Catholicism. Both the church and these special nuns now embrace a unified mission: Faith-based promotion of economic justice and political consensus for the common good.
